Questions about Worship

From time to time, questions come up about some aspect of our worship services. This column will address some of the questions that we encounter. This month there are two questions. Feel free to submit your questions to be answered in future issues.

Why do we sometimes use the Nicene Creed and sometimes the Apostles Creed? In the Church's long heritage, the Nicene Creed is associated with services in which Holy Communion is celebrated. The Apostles Creed is particularly associated with Baptism. At First Presbyterian, we have begun using the Nicene Creed when the Lords Supper is celebrated in the 10:45 service, and we use the Apostles Creed in services where the sacrament is absent. Whenever we confess the Apostles Creed we reminded once again of our baptismal identity as children of God.

Why do we say thanks be to God following the First and Second Readings, and the Gospel, but not after the Psalm? Long before Jesus time, Jewish worshippers sang psalms as responses to the reading of scripture. Early Christians adopted the practice of using psalms as responses to scripture reading in their worship, and we continue that practice today. Since the Psalm is itself a response to the First Reading, we do not add a response to the response by saying thanks be to God as we do for the other readings. By the way, there is nearly always a thematic connection between the First Reading and the Psalm appointed for any given Sunday. Seeking to discern this connection can deepen your worship.

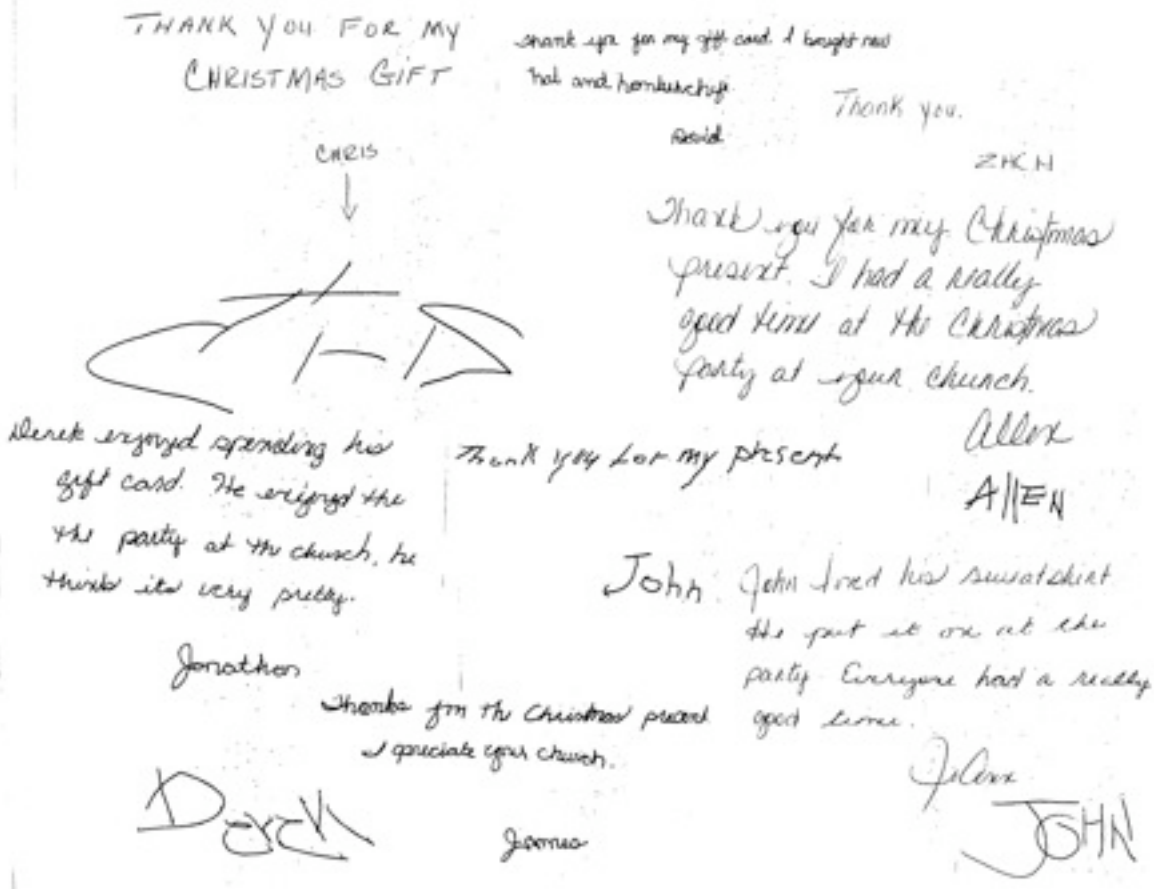
Christmas Thanks from Evergreen Presbyterian Ministries, Inc.

Rev. Lachlan Vass III Dies

DALLAS, Texas -- The Rev. Lachlan Cumming Vass III passed away Friday, Jan. 22, 2010.

A son of Lachlan C. Vass II and Frances Stedman Sharp, he was born Sept. 13, 1915, in the manse of Germantown Presbyterian Church, Germantown, Tenn. He grew up in Cartersville and Dalton, Ga., and St. Elmo, Chattanooga, where his father held pastorates. He graduated from City High School, Chattanooga, and cum laude from Davidson College. He received a bachelor of divinity from Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, where he was awarded the Walter Kennedy Patterson Fellowship in New Testament Greek. Following his ordination as a Presbyterian minister, he married Winifred H. Kellersberger. In 1940, the Vasses were appointed missionaries with the American Presbyterian Congo Mission (APCM), where they served for 30 years. Lach was a third-generation

Presbyterian minister, and both Lach and Winnie were second-generation missionaries in the Belgian Congo. During his tenure, Lach was director of the J. Leighton Wilson Printing Press and served as mission treasurer. After retirement from the mission field, Lach joined the staff of Highland Park Presbyterian Church, Dallas, Texas, as assistant business manager until his retirement in 1983. Lach was preceded in death by his brother, John; and his daughter, Sophie Fontaine Vass. He is survived by his wife of almost 70 years and four daughters, Edna (John) Stucky, Moundridge, Kan., Julia Lake (William) Dudley, Signal Mountain, Tenn., Elizabeth (Reggie) Wilkerson, Laurens, S.C., and Winifred (Todd) Rutenbar, Richardson, Texas; sister, Sophie Simon, Kingston, Tenn.; nine grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren; two great-great-

grandchildren; and devoted nieces and nephews.

Lach and Winnie have resided at Presbyterian Village North (PVN) since 1982. Fellowship of the Least Coin

A Special Offering of the Presbyterian Women

Fellowship of the least coin links prayer and “least coin” in a very significant way, as the “least coin” becomes the symbol of prayer for peace and reconciliation. It was begun in 1956 by Shanti Solomon of India who considered that women anywhere could have a sense of being part of a worldwide family of faith as they prayed for peace and reconciliation in the family, the community, the nation and the world and set aside the “least coin” of their country as a token of that prayer. The giving of the “least coin” was to be only a symbol of the prayer for peace, a symbol made more significant by the gathering of the “least coins” from throughout the world into a common fund where the identity of the donor is lost and the oneness of women in their common quest for peace is symbolized.

Grants are made by an international committee for special projects of evangelism, service and relief throughout the world, particularly programs of development and empowerment of women and opportunities for women to meet internationally and ecumenically.

Presbyterian Women participate in the Fellowship of the Least Coin at each Circle meeting with dedication at First Presbyterian Church in March.

In April, offerings brought by all who gather are dedicated at the Spring Gathering of Presbyterian Women of Holston Presbytery.
